**Subject : Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (EU) 2025/40
(PPWR)**

On 22 January 2025, the European Union published Regulation (EU) 2025/40 on Packaging and Packaging Waste (PPWR) in the Official Journal of the European Union. This Regulation replaces the Packaging and Packaging Waste Directive, which was originally introduced in 1994.

The PPWR is a key component of the EU Circular Economy Action Plan and establishes binding requirements aimed at reducing the environmental impact of packaging, promoting reuse and recycling, and minimizing packaging waste.

Article 5 – Substances in Packaging

1. Substances of Concern

Substances of concern that may be present in packaging materials should be minimized.

Velogy's raw material suppliers have declared the substances that may be present in the raw materials used to manufacture Velogy products. Based on these supplier declarations, any identified substances are not considered harmful to human health under the intended conditions of use. Information on the identified end uses of Velogy products is available in the applicable Product Regulatory Summaries.

Information regarding Substances of Very High Concern (SVHCs), as defined under the REACH Regulation, can be found in Section 15 of the applicable Safety Data Sheet (SDS).

2. Heavy Metals

Article 5 limits the combined concentration of lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent chromium in packaging to a maximum of 100 mg/kg (100 ppm).

Based on available raw material data, supplier declarations, and knowledge of our manufacturing processes, Velogy confirms that these substances are neither intentionally used nor intentionally added during the manufacture of its products.



Accordingly, Velogy declares that the products it manufactures and supplies comply with the 100 ppm limit for the combined concentration of lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent chromium.

3. Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)

PFAS comprise a broad group of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances with a wide range of physicochemical properties. Fluoropolymers are included within the PFAS definition.

From 12 August 2026, food-contact materials and articles containing PFAS at or above the concentration limits specified in Article 5(4) of Regulation (EU) 2025/40 may no longer be placed on the EU market.

Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are neither intentionally used nor intentionally added during the manufacture of Velogy products*.

Summary

Based on available raw material data, supplier declarations, manufacturing process knowledge, and material assessments, Velogy confirms that its products* comply with the requirements of Article 5 of Regulation (EU) 2025/40 on Packaging and Packaging Waste.

This statement is based on information provided by suppliers and other product-related data reasonably available to Velogy. No analytical testing or independent laboratory verification has been performed to confirm compliance.
